# A Certain Justice. Author. P.D. James




The story starts in the courtroom of the Old Bailey, where Venetia Aldridge a distinguished barrister is defending Gary Ashe, accused of the brutal murder of his aunt, with whom he lived. His aunt was a prostitute and she used to get him to watch her and photograph her activities. She successfully defends him, and he is released.

Four weeks later she is found murdered in her locked office in Middle Temple chambers. She is found with a blood splattered barristers' wig, but not hers. Shortly before her death her 18-year-old daughter Octavia announces that she is in love with Gary Ashe and is going to marry him.

Adam Dalgiesh, Commander at New Scotland Yard is called in to investigate what appears to be an inside job. Adam and his team find things are not as simple as they seem, as all the suspects appear to have unbreakable alibis. A second murder occurs later in the story and there is an interesting ending when one of the "murderers "appears to confess with the knowledge that the case could never come to trial because of lack of evidence.

An interesting book with lots of twists and innuendos.



# AUSTRALIA DAY



Australia Day Celebrations 2021 will be in no way celebrated as in years gone by. Did you know Australia Day as a concept has been around for 85 years, but it was only declared a national public holiday in 1994. Before 1935, Australia Day was celebrated by the States and Territories on different days.

So, what happened in 1935 to make January 26 a national Australia Day? Well nothing really. In fact, it still wasn't necessarily on January 26. The Monday nearest to January 26 became the Australia Day holiday after years of petitioning for a national long weekend holiday by the Australian Natives' Association.

The ANA (a society formed lobby group for white men born in Australia) was a key player in the move towards Federation in 1901 too, and it campaigned for things like women's and worker's rights, the protection of native species, compensation for Indigenous Australians, but also for a 'White Australia'.

The association chose January 26 because it's the day Captain Arthur Phillip raised the Union Jack flag in Sydney Cove, officially beginning British colonisation. Captain Cook landed in Botany Bay in April 1770 BUT it wasn't until 1994 that Australia Day was declared a public holiday celebration on January 26, rather than the nearest Monday. While some see January 26 as the birth date of Australia as now know it others sympathetic with the brutal effects of colonisation on Aboriginal people see it as a day of mourning. He first recorded use of the term 'day of mourning' to describe Australia Day was in 1938, when a massive silent march took to the streets of Sydney.

There are a number of alternative dates that have been proposed by people uncomfortable with January 26. In 2018 PM Scott Morrison also floated the idea of a new Indigenous National Day instead of moving Australia Day BUT he hasn't mentioned anything about it since. AND so time goes on! Celebrations will see less people out there celebrating this 2021<sup>st</sup> Australia Day, fireworks will go off with a bang, B.B.Q's will run hot, many will head to the beach for a swim and or even a picnic on the grass. With our summer heat shade is so welcome, sometimes hard to find BUT in each and everyone's way somehow we will, for sure, appreciate living in this beautiful very diverse land we call Australia Home.



1/4 cup cold water
1 Tbs powered gelatine
125g Biscuits
75g Melted butter
500g cream cheese
2/3 cup caster sugar
500g diced mango
300ml thickened cream
1 mango sliced to serve

# Mango Cheesecake (no bake)



- 1. Grease a 22cm springform pan. Line sides with baking paper, 1cm above sides.
- 2. Place water in a small heatproof jug. Sprinkle gelatine over water. Microwave on high 100% for 20 to 30 seconds or until gelatine is dissolved, stirring halfway through cooking. Set aside to cool.
- 3. Process biscuits until fine crumbs, add butter process until combined. Press over base of prepared pan and refrigerate while preparing filling.
- 4. Process cream cheese, sugar and half diced mango until smooth and combined. Add thickened cream. Process for 30 seconds or until combined. With motor running gradually add cooled gelatine mix. Process until combined, transfer to a bowl, fold in remaining diced mango. Pour into prepared pan and refrigerate overnight.
- 5. Serve with sliced mango.

# Christmas pudding cake.



1 kg Christmas pudding. Crumbled 6 litre vanilla ice cream. Softened 2 cups (400g) cherries in syrup, drained, chopped, Plus 2/3 cups (165mls) syrup.

Chocolate shards and fresh cherries for decoration.

- 1. Grease and line base and sides of a 22 cm springform cake pan with baking paper.
- 2. Press 400g pudding into base of pan, spread 2 litre ice cream over this, then cover with remaining 600 g pudding, pressing gently to flatten. Freeze for 2 hours or until firm.
- 3. Meanwhile, fold the chopped cherries and syrup through the remaining 4 litre ice cream. Transfer to a plastic container, cover and freeze, stirring occasionally so the cherries don't sink to the bottom, for 2-3 hours until just firm.
- 4. Using duct tape, secure the ring only (do not use the bottom) of a second 22 cm springform pan to the first pan to form a 2-tier mould. Spread cherry ice cream over the pudding, then cover with plastic wrap and freeze overnight.
- 5. The next day unmould cake by rubbing a hot cloth around pans. Release the top pan first, then the bottom one.

Transfer to a serving plate and freeze until ready to serve.

6. Decorate with chocolate shards and fresh cherries.

Serves 12 people. Recipe used 200g dark chocolate for shards. Thank You, Yvonne!




### Time for some cognitive stimulation.
