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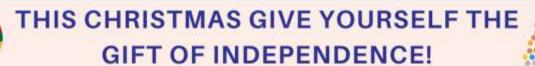


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Mini Lasagna (2 Serves)

(Contributed by Anne Smith)

Prep time: 20 mins Cooking Time: 30min Cooling Time: 15 mins

This mini lasagna recipe uses just 2 lasagna noodle sheets and is layered with

meat, cheese and sauce.

**Equipment**: 5inch baking dish 10 inch skillet

**Ingredients** 

2 lasagna noodles ½ tbspn olive oil

½ cup chopped onions 1 garlic clove minced

8 ounces mince 00.226796185 kilos ½ tspn seasoning

½ tspn salt 1/8 tspn pepper

<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup tomato sauce <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup Ricotta cheese

2 tablespoons Parmesan cheese plus extra for sprinkling on top

½ cup shredded Mozzarella cheese

#### **Instructions**

1. Heat oven to 350 F or 177 C

2. Cook lasagna sheets according to package directions. Drain and set aside.

Heat the oil in a medium sized skillet over a medium heat. Add in the onions and cook for 2 minutes, stirring occasionally.

3. Add in the minced garlic and cook, stirring occasionally for a minute or more.

Add the mince to the pan and sprinkle the seasoning, salt and pepper over the meat. Cook and stir the mince until no longer pink.

4. Stir in ½ cup of tomato sauce, reduce the heat to low and simmer for 3 minutes.

Meanwhile stir the ricotta and 2 tbspn of parmesan together in a small bowl.

#### To assemble the Lasagna

- 1. Spread 3 tablespoons of the sauce into the bottom of a lightly greased small baking dish. Line the bottom of baking dish with noodles. (Note if using unbroken lasagna noodles, they will drape over side of dish)
- 2. Top the noodles with the meat sauce, followed by the ricotta mixture and ½ of the shredded mozzarella
- 3. Fold the noodles over the meat mixture to cover.
- 4. Top with the remaining sauce, mozzarella cheese and parmesan cheese
- 5. Place the baking dish on a large baking sheet (to catch any spillage) and place in the oven to bake for 30 minutes or until cheese on top has melted.

#### "PARIS"

#### **Author Judy Nunn**

Australian actress Samantha Lindsay is thrilled when she scores her first lead movie role in a Hollywood epic "Torpedo Junction", playing a character based on a World War 2 heroine "Mamma Tack".

But as filming begins in Vanuatu, uncanny parallels between history and fiction emerge. Just who was the real Mamma Tack? And what mysterious forces are at play. The answers reveal not only bygone secrets but Sam's own destiny.

In another era, Jane Thackeray travels from England to the far distant islands of the New Hebrides. Ensnared in the turmoil of war. Jane witnesses the devastating effect human conflict has upon an innocent race of people. There she meets Charles "Wolf" Baker, a charismatic fighter pilot, and Jean-François Marat, a powerful plantation owner - and soon their lives are entwined in a maelstrom of love and hate.

This was an interesting book - divided into 2 stories in different eras, but the stories are similar with connections involving the war in the Pacific, and how the British and French governments were running a corrupt establishment and the terrible way the islanders were treated.

#### Gardening and the Environment Article Provided by Glenda Cooper (60 and Better Ipswich Table Tennis Group)

#### MARY RIVER TURTLE

The Mary River freshwater turtle (Elusor macrurus) is one of the most uniquely Australian and critically endangered turtles, living only in South East Queensland's Mary River.

The Mary River turtle primarily inhabits riffle zones and pools in the river where it mostly forages for food. It needs exposed rocks and logs for basking, open, sandy sites along the riverbank for nesting and nocturnal resting areas.

The Mary River turtle has two ways to breathe. When it surfaces, it uses its lungs. But within its tail is a deep cavity lined with gill-like structures that are used for extracting oxygen from the water. This allows the turtle to stay submerged for longer periods and has led to it being known as a 'bum breather'.

The Mary River turtle has very long back legs to dig nesting chambers deep enough to avoid the extreme temperatures that occur on the surface of the ground. It takes about twenty years for a Mary River turtle to reach breeding age.

Cats, dogs, foxes and known to prey on female freshwater turtles as they lay eggs, including the Mary River Turtle. Consequently, the population of this species was plummeting even before it was recognised and described as a distinct species.

**Note:** Jerry was actively involved in the Save the Mary River campaign. This community organisation gathered the science and united the community which led to the proposal of the Traveston Dam being rejected. As a consequence, this unique, endangered, endemic freshwater turtle now has a better chance of survival, along with the threatened Mary River cod, and the largest remaining population of world's oldest living vertebrate species, the Queensland lungfish.
