

JAMES BACKHOUSE NURSERYMAN BOTANIST & QUAKER MISSIONARY

James Backhouse was born into a Quaker business family in Yorkshire, England in 1794, and at the age of 30, became a Quaker minister.

Struck down with tuberculosis as a child, he was advised to spend time in the open air and to study botany.

James Backhouse came to Australia with a fellow Quaker as missionaries in 1831. They arrived in Van Dieman's Land to establish missions among convicts, settlers and aboriginals alike. James Backhouse was given access to all government convict and aboriginal establishments, working for the easing of adverse conditions for them. He spent six years in Australia, having spent time in all the Australian colonies from Swan River to Moreton Bay and Norfolk Island, leaving in 1837 for missionary work in South Africa.

During those six hectic years of unceasing labour, Backhouse exercised his hobby discovering, collecting and sending back to English Botanists and nurserymen, hundreds of botanical specimens, plants and seeds of Australian plants new to science, and that is why, when two Botanists were naming some of the Australian flora, they honoured Backhouse, by bestowing his surname on the thirteen species of white flowering native myrtles.

Perhaps the best known is Backhousia Citriodora, the lemon scented myrtle, the scented leaves of this easy to grow plant grown commercially to produce a particular food flavouring. The leaves have the highest citronella oil content of any plant. It is an insecticide and used in some medicinal and beauty products. This is a relatively slow growing medium-sized tree with lovely, soft new growth on darker, olive green foliage.

Seven of the species of the native myrtles are listed in the book "Mangroves to Mountains" as growing naturally in South East Queensland.

Budget Friendly Baked Berry and Oats

Serves 6

Can be frozen in pieces and reheated in the microwave

Ingredients	Method
2 cups rolled oats 3/4 cup chopped almonds 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon 1/2 teaspoon baking soda 1/2 teaspoon salt 1 3/4 cups milk (dairy or dairy-free) 1/4 cup honey or maple syrup 2 large eggs Spray canola oil 2 teaspoons vanilla extract	Preheat the oven 190°C Spray large baking dish will oil Add oats, almonds, cinnamon, baking soda, and salt to a large bowl and stir together. In another bowl, whisk together the milk, honey, eggs and vanilla. Add all ingredients to the large bowl including frozen berries and stir. Bake for 45 minutes, or until set.
2 ½ cups frozen mixed berries	Serve warm with yoghurt!



BOOK REVIEW with Yvonne



MARALINGA

During the darkest days of the Cold War, in the remote wilderness of a South Australian desert, the future of an infant nation is being decided without its people's knowledge.

A British airbase in the middle of nowhere; an atomic weapons testing ground, an army of raw youth led by powerful ambitious men - a cocktail for disaster.

Such is Maralinga in the Spring of 1956.

Maralinga is the story of a British Lieutenant Daniel Gardener, who accepts a twelve month posting to the wilds of South Australia, on a promise of fast promotion.

Harold Dartleigh, Deputy Director of MI6 and his undercover operative Gideon Melbray, Australian Army Colonel Nick Stratton and the enigmatic Petreaus Mitchell, bushman and anthropologist. They all find themselves in a violent and unforgiving madness and excitement that only nuclear testing creates.

Maralinga is also a story of love; a love so strong that it draws the adventurous young journalist Elizabeth Hoffman halfway around the world, in search of the truth. And Maralinga is a story of heartbreak, heartbreak brought to the innocent First Australians, who walked their land unhindered for 40,000 years.

This story is based on true happenings, but because of the nature of the tests and everybody covered by the Secrets Act, only what the authorities wanted the public to know was released.

An interesting story and an insight into some of our not so infamous history.




